

Scenic Drive Directions

Beckley Creek Park to Broad Run Park – Traveling North to South

Looking for a scenic drive to enjoy the season?

Follow these directions to explore The Parklands via car.

Directions to Beckley Creek Park from Downtown

- I-64 East
- I-265 (Gene Snyder Freeway) North
- Take the Middletown exit and turn right onto Shelbyville Road toward Eastwood
- Drive approximately 1.5 miles and enter the park on the right (across from Valhalla Golf Course) by turning onto Beckley Creek Parkway

Begin your scenic drive in Beckley Creek Park!

- Follow the park road in the direction of the Egg Lawn/Creekside Center (about 1.5 miles).
- After crossing under I-64 you will come to the Egg Lawn. Take a left at the stop sign to follow the road around the lawn. Take another left at the next stop sign (toward Humana Grand Allee) and continue for 1.2 miles along Beckley Creek Parkway, traveling through the Humana Grand Allee and Distillery Bend.
- You will then reach a stop sign at Echo Trail, which is the exit of Beckley Creek Park. Turn right onto Echo Trail, followed by a quick left onto S. English Station Rd.

Directions from Beckley Creek Park to Pope Lick Park

- Continue on S. English Station Rd. for 0.6 miles. Once you reach Taylorsville Rd., continue straight onto Old Taylorsville Rd. (you will pass an old gas station on the left).
- At the stop sign, turn right to stay on Old Taylorsville Rd. and continue for 0.8 miles. Along the way, you will pass Fisherville Paddling Access.
- Once you reach the stop sign at S. Pope Lick Rd., take a left into Pope Lick Park. Travel along S. Pope Lick Rd., where you can park to explore Pope Lick Park on foot or take a short drive before continuing on to Turkey Run Park.

Directions from Pope Lick Park to Turkey Run Park

- Travel back toward the park entrance on S. Pope Lick Rd. Take a right onto Old Taylorsville Rd. Travel 0.2 miles and take a left onto Hatmaker Trail. At the stop sign, turn right onto Taylorsville Rd.
- At the stop light, continue straight onto Taylorsville Lake Rd.
- Continue onto Taylorsville Lake Rd. for 1.2 miles. Stay in the right lane and turn right onto Routt Rd.
- Travel along Routt Rd. for 0.8 miles and turn right onto Thurman Rd.
- Follow Thurman Rd. for 1.5 miles. At the stop sign, and turn right onto Echo Trail.
- Continue on Echo Trail for 1.9 miles and turn right at Brush Run Rd.

- Shortly after turning right onto Brush Run Rd., you will turn left onto Turkey Run Parkway, entering Turkey Run Park.

Directions Through Turkey Run Park to Broad Run Park

- Continue straight on Turkey Run Parkway for 1.2 miles, passing the meadows of Seaton Valley and hills near Boulder Pond.
- After traveling on Turkey Run Parkway for 1.2 miles, you will reach a stop sign and a fork in the road. Take a left onto Turkey Run Parkway.
- Travel along Turkey Run Parkway, passing the Ben Stout House and the Brown-Forman Silo Center along the way.
- After 1 mile of scenic travel along Turkey Run Parkway, you will reach a stop sign, which is the end of Turkey Run Park.
- From this stop sign, take a right onto Broad Run Road and a quick left onto Broad Run Parkway, entering Broad Run Park.
- Continue straight on Broad Run Parkway for 1.2 miles, passing Broad Run Valley, Limestone Gorge and Big Vista Overlook.
- Once you pass these landmarks on Broad Run Parkway, you will reach Cliffside Center, which includes Cliffside Playground & Sprayground and the Woodland Pavilion.
- To exit Broad Run Park, the most southern part of The Parklands, continue on Broad Run Parkway from Cliffside Center for 0.8 miles until you reach the stop light at Bardstown Rd. Turn right at the stop light and continue straight for 4.1 miles to reach I-265 Gene Snyder.
