



CAMP INFORMATION & DETAILS

Camp Information:

Each camp includes a balanced day of indoor and outdoor activities, recess time and a 30 minute break for lunch. Space is limited and advance registration is required. Full payment for all camp programs is due at the time of booking. In case of an emergency during camp hours, please call 502-815-0274. We will respond as soon as possible. All parents/guardians should provide camp staff with a completed Health History Form, Camp Permission Form and Emergency Action Plan (if necessary) upon arrival of camp.

Drop Off and Pick Up Procedures

Camp hours are Monday-Friday, 9 a.m. – 4 p.m. daily with a half hour drop-off period from 8:30 a.m. – 9 a.m. each morning, and a one hour pick up period from 4 p.m. – 5 p.m. each afternoon. Parents/Guardians may opt to drop off late or pick up early, but please be advised that campers may be participating in camp activities in the park and time should be allotted for travel back to the PNC Achievement Center. All parents/guardians are required to walk their child into camp each morning. Only those listed on the Camper Health History Form will be able to pick up and a photo ID must be provided at the time of pick up. There is no late care service; all campers must be picked up no later than 5:00pm. Parents/Guardians will be subject to an automatic credit card charge of \$1 per minute for each minute after 5:00pm.

What to Bring

Campers should wear appropriate attire for outdoor activity and that can get wet and muddy (please no flip-flops, wheelies or open toed shoes of any kind). Most camps will be participating in creek and outdoor activities where the child can expect to get muddy and wet, so appropriate clothing is required. If wading in the stream campers will be required to keep their shoes on. Old tennis shoes, water shoes, or strap on sandals work well. A change of clothes and shoes is recommended for comfort, but not necessary. Food will not be provided as a part of the camp day; all campers should bring a lunch and snack that does not require refrigeration and a bottle for water that can be refilled, each day. A backpack is suggested but not necessary.

Directions

The PNC Achievement Center for Education and Interpretation is located in the Creekside Center in Beckley Creek Park. Our address is 1411 S Beckley Creek Parkway, Louisville, KY 40245. Directions are as follows: Take I-64 East to I-265 (Gene Snyder Freeway) North; take the Middletown exit and turn right onto Shelbyville Road. It is approximately 0.8 miles to Beckley Station Road – turn right at the stop light onto Beckley Station Road. Follow 1.7 miles to the Beckley Creek Park entrance on left (before intersection of Beckley Station and Wibble Hill Road).

Cancellation Policy

Campers who cancel 30 days prior to the program start date will be refunded in full. Any camper who cancels within the 30 day period will be subject to the retention of the entire camp fee. No refunds will be issued for “no shows”. In the event of an extreme circumstance that prevents your child from attending camp, you may submit a Request to Withdraw Form to Camp Staff that must be approved by the Parks Director and Chief Financial Officer. 21st Century Parks will withhold fees for all days attended by the camper in addition to a \$25 handling fee. 21st Century Parks reserves the right to cancel sessions due to insufficient enrollment or inclement weather; without prior notice at which point a full refund will be issued.

Inherent Risk Clause

Outdoor and adventure activities involve inherent risks that are sometimes impossible to know or predict, including but not limited to: narrow trails; rough, exposed, steep or slippery terrain; lightning, cold weather, wild animals, plants and insects; fires and other acts of nature. We constantly strive to provide programs that respect emotional, social, intellectual and physical safety. Participants and/or guardians acknowledge their understanding of, and agreement to, participate in potentially unsafe programs by signing appropriate Health and Safety forms.

No Violence Policy

The Parklands of Floyds Fork has a No Violence policy in place to keep summer campers and other park visitors safe and having fun. Failure to comply with this policy may result in your child being asked to leave camp with no refund provided. Parents will be notified if this policy is violated.
